Cosmic Canvas: Exploring the Universe Through Art



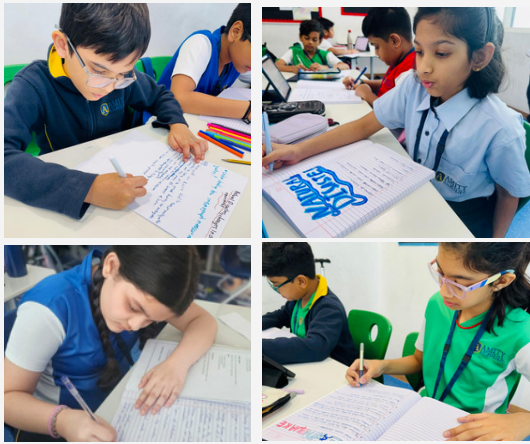

Wellbeing Wednesday continued to follow the PERMAH Model and was delivered through student volunteers. For Grades 1 to 5, the focus was on Challenge vs Skill. Students reflected on how learning becomes more meaningful when challenges are matched with their abilities. The theme encouraged students to understand that the right balance between challenge and skill helps build confidence, engagement, and a sense of success in the classroom.

The session encouraged students to recognise that tasks which are too easy may lead to boredom, while overly difficult tasks can create anxiety, while the perfect balance helps them enter their “FLOW” state where learning becomes enjoyable and meaningful.

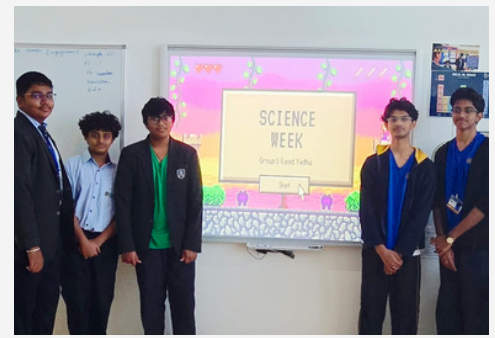


Balancing Academics and Co-Scholastic Excellence



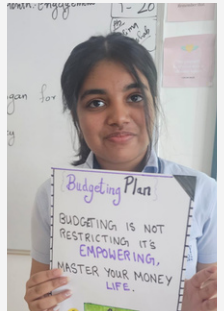
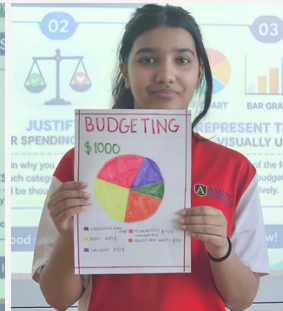
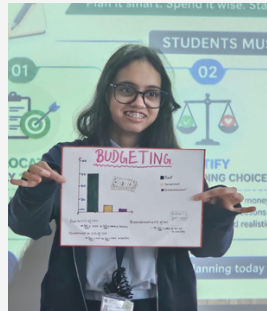
