Tiny Hands, Big Discoveries: A Week of Senses, Sounds & Numbers

This week in KG 1, our little ones enjoyed a sensory experience using their sense of touch and taste. They explored and tasted coffee, lemon, honey, and chips, describing them as sweet, sour, bitter, and crunchy.



As part of our Phonics 'p' sound, children brought objects from home beginning with the /p/ sound and shared items like pen, pencil, plate, and picture. They also practiced blending simple /p/ words, building early reading confidence in a fun and engaging way.



In Math, K1 learners explored number concepts through counting, number recognition, and interactive activities that made learning numbers fun and meaningful.

This week, KG enjoyed co-scholastic activities where they developed fine motor skills through fun movements. Read-aloud sessions with the Reading Coach sparked imagination, finger printing in Creative Art encouraged creativity, dance sessions filled the classroom with music, movement, joy, and confidence.

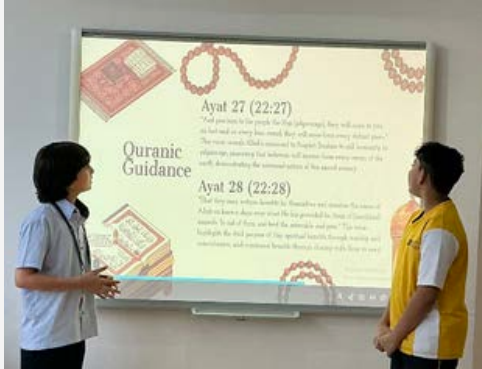


Investiture Ceremony
